 - A maximum of **88** credit hours can transfer and directly apply towards the **B.S. in Business Administration** program requirements (AAS in Business Administration + Additional Transfer Coursework section)
- This transfer agreement will be revised by CNM and Lewis University each academic year, by the Office of Academic Affairs at CNM and the Executive Director of the Albuquerque Campus for Lewis University.
- This Transfer Articulation Agreement shall not exceed eight (8) years.
