- Students completing the Associate of Applied Science in Criminal Justice at Central New Mexico Community College can apply those credits and courses directly toward one of the Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice at Lewis University.
- The Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice is offered in different modalities/locations: Online, at the Albuquerque Lewis University Campus, and at the Lewis University Main Campus.
- There is a total of **96** credit hours of transfer coursework listed within this articulation agreement, AAS coursework plus the additional transfer coursework section at the end of the agreement. All coursework listed within this agreement will transfer and directly apply towards the Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice.
- This transfer agreement will be revised by CNM and Lewis University each academic year, by the Office of Academic Affairs at CNM and the Executive Director of the Albuquerque Campus for Lewis University.
- This Transfer Articulation Agreement shall not exceed eight (8) years.
