- Students completing the Associate of Arts in Teacher Education, Special Education Concentration at Central New Mexico Community College can apply those credits and courses directly toward one of the Bachelor of Arts degree programs listed at New Mexico Highlands University.
- NMHU School of Education admission requirements: C or better in GNED 201(CNM's EDUC 1102), GNED 251 (CNM's EDUC 1190), SPED 214 (CNM's SPED 2201), ENGL 111 (CNM's ENG 1101) and ENGL 112 (CNM's ENG 1102); and an overall GPA of 2.5 or better.
- Upon completion of the coursework prescribed within this transfer agreement, students will have earned an A.A. in Elementary and Special Education and transfer to NMHU as a classified junior. Additionally, with their Associate of Arts students will have the NMHU institutional Physical Education, Language Competency core, and Minor requirements waived.
