- The transfer and articulation of the commonly numbered coursework and New Mexico general education core structure within this articulation agreement is in alignment with the Post-Secondary Education Articulation Act, 21-1B, NMSA 1978.
- This transfer agreement will be revised by CNM and Western New Mexico University each academic year, by the Office of Academic Affairs at CNM and the Registrar for Western New Mexico University.
- This Transfer Articulation Agreement shall not exceed eight (8) years.
