Your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. The law says that, before awarding Federal Student Aid, we may ask you to confirm the information you reported on your FAFSA. To verify that you provided correct information, we will compare your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet and with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents and submit the form and documents to the Financial Aid Office at Main campus, or the CNM Connect Center at any branch campus. We may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact our office.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR TAX FILERS

The best way to verify income is by using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool that is part of FAFSA on the Web. If you have not already used the tool, go to FAFSA.gov, log in to your FAFSA record, select “Make FAFSA Corrections,” and navigate to the Financial Information section of the form. From there, follow the instructions to determine if you/your parent(s) are eligible to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer 2017 IRS income tax information into your FAFSA. If you/your parent(s) are unable or choose not to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, you will need to request and submit a tax return transcript, or submit a signed copy of the 1040(A/EZ) filed with the IRS. You may request a transcript of your 2017 tax return (and W2’s if requested) online at www.irs.gov, by calling 1-800-908-9946 or completing and mailing a form 4506T, which can be printed from the IRS website.

NOTE: If you or your parent(s) had to amend your taxes you must provide a “Tax Return Transcript” AND a signed Amended Form 1040X.
